

Modern Chevron Throw

Materials Needed Stylecraft Special DK



The easy chevron blanket is made using solid granny squares, joined to create the chevron effect. Each granny square only has 4 rounds making them quick and easy. Once all squares have been made, using the chart below they are then positioned and joined using a simple single crochet join.

Measures 41" x 56"

You will need to make the following amounts in each color.



Claret 30 Squares



Tomato 30 Squares



Spice 30 Squares




Saffron 28 Squares



White 103 Squares

Chart
Lay your squares out according to the chart. I find it best to lay them out face down so the reverse side is showing ready for joining



Full Solid Granny Square

On a 4mm hook each square measures approximately 3" x 3"

Chain 4, slip st into 1st ch to create a loop.

Round 1

Ch3 (counts as dc) 2dc in to loop. Ch2, 3dc, ch2, 3dc, ch2, 3dc, ch2. Join to 3rd ch of beginning ch3.

= 3 dc each side, Total 12 dc, 4 ch2 spaces

Round 2

Ch3 (counts as dc), dc in next 2 sts, (2dc, ch2, 2dc) in ch2 corner space.

- *dc in next 3 sts, (2dc, ch2, 2dc) in ch2 corner space* Repeat 2 more times. Join to 3rd ch of beginning ch3
- = 7 dc each side. Total 28 dc, 4 ch2 spaces

Round 3


Ch3 (counts as dc), dc in next 4 sts, (2dc, ch2, 2dc) in ch2 corner space.

- *dc in next 7 sts, (2dc, ch2, 2dc) in ch2 corner space* Repeat 2 more times. dc in next 2 sts. Join to 3rd ch of beginning ch3
- = 11dc each side. Total 44 dc, 4 ch2 space

Round 4

Ch3 (counts as dc), dc in next 6 sts, (2dc, ch2, 2dc) in ch2 corner space.

- *dc in next 11 sts, (2dc, ch2, 2dc) in ch2 corner space* Repeat 2 more times. dc in next 4 sts. Join to 3rd ch of beginning ch3, fasten off.
- = 15dc each side. Total 60dc, 4 ch2 spaces



Joining


Lay your squares out according to the chart. I find it best to lay them out face down so the reverse side is showing ready for joining

Work on the reverse side of your work, each join starts with a standing stitch.


Work 1 sc into the back loops of each corresponding stitch, and 1 sc through corresponding chain



First, work one direction and then the other. When you work the second direction and come to a cross over at the corners of the squares, ch 1 over the previous join.



Working from left to right and then bottom to top



Border

Round 1. – White

Start in any corner ch sp with a standing st. *(sc, ch2, sc), sc in each st and each ch sp to next corner space* repeat, Join to first.

Round 2 – White

Start in any corner sp with a standing st, *(hdc ch2 hdc), hdc in each st to next corner sp* Repeat. Join to first st. Fasten off

Round 3 - Saffron

Begin with a standing stitch in any corner. 4hdc in the corner ch2 space, hdc in the 3rd loop of each stitch to next corner. Repeat around, join. Fasten ff

Round 4 - Spice

Begin with a standing hdc in the 3rd loop of any stitch. Hdc in the 3rd loop of each stitch around. Join. Fasten off

Round 5 – Claret

Begin with a standing sc in the 3rd loop of any stitch. Sc in the 3rd loop of each stitch around. Join. Fasten off

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
